Executive Summary

North Jackson High School is located in the Northeast corner of Jackson County, Alabama. It is a feeder school with other small local communities in Bridgeport and Hollywood, Alabama. We are classified as a 4A school with a total enrollment of 479. We, along with all schools in the system, are a Title I school that receives federal government funds. Currently, 74% of our students receive free or reduced-priced meals. We are the only 9th-12th grade school in the Jackson County School System. Our school is diverse with 77.87% white, 10.02% African-American, 3.76% American Indian, and 6.48% Hispanic.

North Jackson High School was established in 1988, with the first graduation being held in 1989. The school was a consolidation project to bring Stevenson High School and Bridgeport High School together in one school. The population for the area is approximately 15,000 residents. The demographics of the school are a representation of the area.

North Jackson High School awarded 3.1 million dollars in scholarships to the graduating class of 2016. In the Spring of 2016 we recognized over 200 students in our Academic Excellence program.

Our current goals are to increase reading and math proficiency, performance in reading and literacy on the ACT. We want to improve the student attendance rate and find ways to positively motivate overall attendance. We also want to increase parental awareness and parental involvement.

North Jackson has identified stakeholder involvement as an area in need of improvement. We need to increase our number of parent surveys that are completed.

98% of our teachers are highly qualified and 98% of our classes are taught by highly-qualified teachers. According to the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, teacher credentials can be requested by the parent at any time.

North Jackson has been able to equip all classrooms and science labs with either an overhead projector or Promethean Board. All classrooms have wireless internet access, and the majority of classrooms have Apple TVs.

In the next three years, NJHS hopes to implement, with the help of the Jackson County School District, a one-to-one initiative that will place technology in the hands of each NJHS student. Also, NJHS will strive to update digital projectors to HD.



Areas of Notable Achievement

North Jackson High School surveyed parents, students, and staff for performance standards of school effectiveness and student achievement. The areas that scored most highly by all subgroups over the past two years were Indicators (1.1) The school engages in a systematic, inclusive, and comprehensive process to review, revise, and communicate a school purpose for student success, and Indicator (3.6) Teachers implement the school's instructional process in support of student learning.

Parents rated all standards of excellence higher than teachers or students rated them with the highest position for Indicator (3.9) The school has a formal structure whereby each student is well known by at least one adult advocate in the school who supports that student's educational experiences. Additionally, parents gave the school a high score on Indicator (3.6) Teachers implement the school's instructional process in support of student learning. This demonstrates parents' overall satisfaction with North Jackson High School's educational climate. Staff surveys indicated additional accomplishments for Indicator (1.2) The school's leadership and staff commit to a culture that is based on shared values and beliefs about teaching and learning and supports challenging, equitable educational programs and learning experiences for all students that include achievement of learning, thinking, and life skills; Indicator (1.3) The school's leadership implements a continuous improvement process that provides clear direction for improving conditions that support student learning; and Indicator (2.1) The governing body establishes policies and supports practices that ensure effective administration of the school. This signifies a high level of teacher satisfaction and accomplishment at North Jackson High School.

Student surveys cited the lowest asset for the past two years Indicator (2.1) The governing body establishes policies and supports practices that ensure effective administration of the school, even though staff surveys rated it highly. This indicates students and staff have incompatible expectations about the policies and practices that render effective administration. Indicator (4.3) The school maintains facilities, services, and equipment to provide a safe, clean, and healthy environment for all students and staff. This indicator has been in the top 3 lowest for the last 3 years.

The other low strength generated by staff and parent surveys was Indicator (3.8) The school engages families in meaningful ways in their children's education and keeps them informed of their children's learning progress. Indicator 3.8 has been in the low category for the last few years.

Which area(s) show a trend toward decreasing stakeholder satisfaction or approval?

Indicator (3.5) Teachers participate in collaborative learning communities to improve instruction and student learning, and Indicator 3.8 as mentioned above show a trend toward decreasing stakeholder satisfaction or approval.

What are the implications for these stakeholder perceptions?

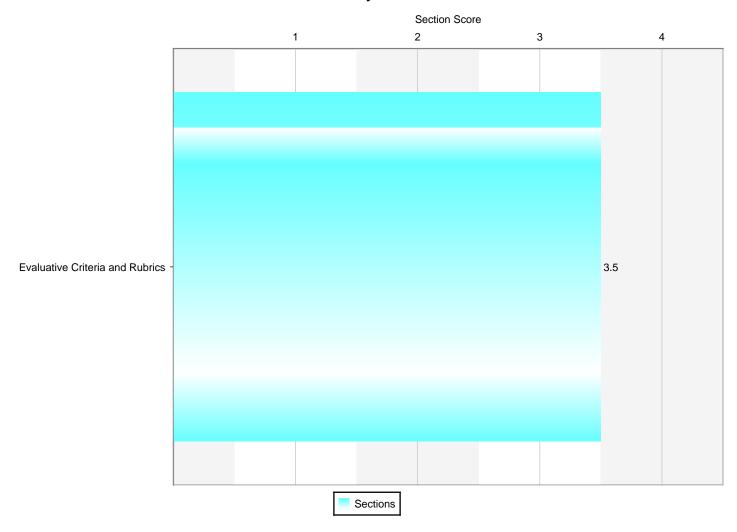
It is clear from survey results that parents, students, and staff express overall satisfaction and approval of North Jackson High School's administration and educational programs. Yet, to improve perceived weaknesses, NJHS will pursue a course of action to implement additional strategies to increase involvement and expand student engagement practices to increase student learning. North Jackson will assemble a committee of students, parents, teachers, and business leaders to develop a stakeholder communication plan to improve communication with all stakeholders. Additionally, North Jackson High School will continue its efforts to improve the safety and appearance of school facilities.

1. How was the comprehensive needs assessment conducted?

The faculty met to disaggregate data and determine strengths and weaknesses in core subjects as well as behavior reports and attendance. After identifying weaknesses, teachers formulated goals and strategies to address these weaknesses in the A-CIP. The ACT was given in the spring to all juniors as a cohort. We have given tests and analyzed our attendance data. In addition to this we looked at the SIR report, checked our staffing changes, free and reduced lunch percentages, and conducted Advanced ED surveys

2. What were the results of the comprehensive needs assessment?

The ACT results yielded that we had a total of 86 students tested. Out of these students, 33% tested to be ready for college level English composition and 6% showed to be ready for college algebra. The percent of students who tested to be ready for college level social sciences was 17%, while, 7% of these students were considered to be ready for college biology. This information yielded that 2% of the students tested met all four standards. The SIR report yielded that we had a total of 47 incident reports with 44.6% of those incidents being fighting. At North Jackson 24% of our faculty are new to the school. 64.93% of our student population receive free lunch with 8.98% receiving reduced lunch. We had insufficient data when conducting our Advanced ED surveys.

3. What conclusions were drawn from the results?

In 2016-2017 school year we will strive to better prepare our students for college level material. We need to implement new ways and procedures to yield more parent participation in our surveys. We will have an Open House in September. We also will focus on decreasing total student absences and unexcused absences.

We have developed an Advocacy Program so each student will feel that they are important and to meet other students. We hope that this will help in decreasing absences

4. What information was concluded as a result of analyzing perception, student achievement, school programs/process, and demographic data?

We realized that most of our disciplinary problems stem from the male freshmen demographic with a reduction in incidents concerning the prior freshman females. We are an extremely new staff and we are dealing with a low socioeconomic student population based on our free and reduced lunch data.

5. How are the school goals connected to priority needs and the needs assessment?

All staff analyze data from the previous year which includes ACT, attendance report, discipline report, parent and student surveys. One of our goals is to increase parental involvement; therefore we developed an Effective Communication Plan. We conducted a meeting in August 2016 that included faculty, parents, students, and business leaders. We also are having an Open House on September 1, 2016. We also will focus more on how to lower student absences for this year.

6. How do the goals portray a clear and detailed analysis of multiple types of data?

The school administration and faculty are currently analyzing ideas on how to increase parental involvement based on the low survey participation. We have scheduled an Open House, Eighth Grade Night, and Effective Communication Plan to increase stakeholder involvement. We have also analyzed student survey data and developed a student advocacy program.

7. How do the goals address the needs of the whole school population and special recognition to children who are disadvantaged?

All students identified as Special Populations, have access to all services and programs available, including free/reduced lunch, Title I services, EL services, Special Education services, and counseling services. North Jackson High School uses the Department of Human Resources, the Department of Mental Health, and various community resources to provide students with necessary school supplies, food, clothing and shelter

The hiring and training of staff is the responsibility of the principal and superintendent, who interview potential teachers displaying the best qualifications to fill the position that is available. Each assignment is based on teacher qualifications and courses offered. All lesson plans reflect Alabama College and Career Readiness standards and follow the Alabama Course of Study. Component 4: Strategies to Attract Qualified Teachers

1. What is the school's teacher turnover rate for this school year?

Upon the opening day of the 2016-2017school year, 19 teachers out of 27 were returning for the second or more years. 29% of teachers are new teachers for the 2016-2017 school year at North Jackson High School.

2. What is the experience level of key teaching and learning personnel?

The total career experience of each key teaching and learning personnel is 292 years with an average of 10.8 years of career experience per teacher. The total North Jackson High School experience among the key teaching and learning personnel is 182 years with an average of 6.7 years teaching at North Jackson High School specifically.

3. If there is a high turnover rate, what initiatives has the school implemented to attempt to lower the turnover rate?

New teachers are assigned mentors within the school, and are monitored for the first three years by the administration. North Jackson is a learning institution that welcomes newly trained, high quality teachers who employ research-based educators. The one aspect of our administration is to ensure that teacher morale is high and trust is established with all teachers. It is our belief that this has a ripple effect for student success in the classroom. All teachers' values and opinions are regarded as important and necessary for the school to function as an entity.

Component 5: High Quality and Ongoing Professional Development

1. Identify the professional development activities included in the schoolwide plan that are high quality, effective, and research-based?

Applications are requested district-wide when openings are available to choose only those teachers who are highly qualified. The decision of hiring highly qualified staff is made by the local school and superintendent. Principals are required to have the knowledge of each teacher's highly qualified status and the area the teacher is highly qualified to teach. All scheduling and assignment decisions must be made using this information. New teachers are assigned mentors within the school, and are monitored for the first three years by the administration and Central Office staff. All teachers are required to participate in professional development activities organized by the administration of the local school and encouraged to seek additional professional development activities. Funding for high-quality, on-going activities is provided by local, state, and federal funds.

2. Identify the professional development opportunities for teachers, principals, paraprofessionals, other staff, and parents that are included in the schoolwide plan?

North Jackson High School has experienced some turnover for the 2016-2017 school year. This was simply due to family locale within system transfers. We have created an environment to retain the new staff we have hired. We are proud of our new staff and are certain they are complacent in their roles as educators within our school. Any issues they have are immediately addressed and dealt with by their mentors and administration to thwart off any negativity they may face. Teacher complacency is critical when dealing with new teachers and their own personal morale towards the administration, students, and the school as a whole.

3. Identify the teacher mentoring activities included in the schoolwide plan. For example, new or inexperienced teachers are given support from an assigned master teacher.

Teacher mentoring activities include:

- Providing a veteran teacher to encourage and confidentially discuss topics and provide guidance
- Providing Research-based Instructional strategies
- Scheduling departmental, grade level, and team meetings
- Conducting formal and informal classroom observations with timely feedback
- Sharing tricks of the trade and strategies that work

Professional development is sustained and ongoing as educational needs are continually identified and addressed through formal and informal assessments. Professional development must be spread out over time to allow participants to fully understand and accomplish the goals and objectives of the program. In addition, it must allow time for practice, observation, feedback, and additional support to be implemented.

Component 6: Transition Strategies

1. Identify the strategies in the schoolwide plan that support and assist students in transitioning from one grade level to the next. For example, preschool preparation for Kindergarten and/or eighth grade transition to high school.

Materials at the Parent Center are updated and are available for parental use. Transition packets are available for kindergartners, 4th graders, and 8th graders. North Jackson High School realizes that students need support emotionally and academically during periods of transition from middle school to high school, and from high school to junior colleges, four-year universities, and career/technical programs. Transition activities and opportunities are as follows:

All freshmen at North Jackson High School are provided a smooth transition process from middle school to high school. Efforts are taken to ensure students gain a sense of connectedness.

A parent/student information meeting is held each spring to inform parents and students about North Jackson High School, as well as to answer any questions that parents or students may have about activities, academics, athletics, or other school programs.

Each spring, rising freshmen attend new student orientation where they become familiar with the facilities at North Jackson High School, meet with faculty, and learn about the courses offered, and opportunities for involvement at the school.

Special Education students have transition goals written into their IEPs. These goals focus on the areas of postsecondary education/training, employment/occupational/career; and community/independent living goals. Students meet weekly with resource teachers to discuss, review, research, and complete activities to aid in meeting the goals developed by the IEP team. Additionally, students pursuing an Alabama High School Diploma on the Essential/Life Skills Pathway complete a required transition studies course offered at the Ernest Pruitt Center of Technology. All special education students are referred to the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services for vocational evaluations, assistance in job placement, or assistance with accommodations at the post-secondary level.

The career coach meets with all students to work on four year plans and career assessments.

Seniors at North Jackson High School have opportunities to take dual enrollment classes through Northeast Alabama Community College to aid in the transition from high school to college.

Seniors are given opportunities to attend college preview days at various colleges. The counselor assists students with scholarship/college applications.

Seniors have the opportunity to participate in Talent Search. Through this program, a representative of NACEE meets with students monthly to assist with prospective scholarships.

Representatives from branches of the military and various colleges, universities, and career/technical institutions are brought in to discuss their programs with students at North Jackson High School.

Component 7: Teacher Participation in Making Assessment Decisions

1. What measures are in place to include teachers in decisions regarding the use of results of statewide academic assessments?

North Jackson High School teachers are involved in decisions regarding the use of state academic assessments. Teachers will administer assessments to determine if students have mastered objectives taught. These assessments are used to determine if further instruction can continue or if remedial activities need to be implemented. Teacher input is considered at different levels of assessment results.

The following are various ways that teachers make decisions that guide instruction:

- -The faculty collaboratively studies the disaggregated data and results of the state assessments.
- -RTI/PST evaluate data collected on referred students to determine if there are any indicators that would warrant more in depth testing or referral for special services.
- -Subject area data meetings are held to adjust instructional procedures and strategies based on the progress monitoring data.

Faculty discuss ways in which to help the student better understand the areas where need is the most great.

Teacher representation and teacher in put is included on school budget committees, policy committees, textbook selection committees, and school calendar committees. This voice allows teachers to be involved in all areas of overall instruction and testing

Component 8: Timely and Additional Assistance to Students Having Difficulty Mastering the Standards

1. What is the process to identify students who experience difficulty mastering the State's academic achievement assessment standards at an advanced or proficient level?

Students who experience difficulty mastering the proficient or advanced achievement standards will be provided timely, effective, and additional instructional assistance. This will be accomplished by:

- Teacher review of student permanent records, previous test results, and any other important information which will help a teacher determine strengths and weaknesses of a student
- Communication with previous teachers and parents who have insights about student's learning styles.
- Use of peer tutors
- Opportunities to meet with teachers for after school tutoring
- Parental involvement in student education through school conferences and letters.
- Students with additional learning needs are provided a Resource Intervention period where they can go and receive additional assistance in any core related subject. This period is dedicated for individual one-on-one instruction with a highly qualified trained faculty member who specializes in reading strategies for students with special needs.

2. How is timely, effective, additional assistance provided to students who are experiencing difficulty mastering the State's academic achievement assessment standards at an advanced or proficient level?

For struggling students, reform strategies are used. Students who score below 70 in any academic area are referred to the RTI/ PST for interventions and strategies. Student progress is monitored and recommendations are made. Students who struggle to meet the standards are also aided by:

- Teacher review of student permanent records, previous test results, and any other important information which will help a teacher determine strengths and weaknesses of a student
- Communication with previous teachers and parents who have insights about student's learning styles.
- Classroom teachers identify students who score 69 and below at each grading period, or 4.5 weeks.
- Classroom teachers identify and document strategies to implement with the student. Strategies are actions the teacher will implement in the classroom.
- In addition, for students who score 59 and below, the classroom teacher contacts the parent/guardian to discuss strategies they can implement at home to help the student. Two documented attempts at contact. Attempts may include phone call, email, letter, etc...
- The principal is responsible for managing contact for his/her school.
- Timely Assistance is to be maintained in the classroom of the affected teacher. (in a folder with teacher name, subject and grade level)
- Documentation is sent to a secure, central location at the end of each year.
- Kept for a minimum of 5 years.

3. How are students' individual needs being addressed through differentiated instruction in the classroom?

Students attending North Jackson High School follow the Alabama Course of Study for their curriculum. Students in grades 9-12 follow the state guidelines for diploma options. For struggling students, reform strategies are used. NJHS provides special education services and uses appropriate procedures in accordance with federal and state laws and mandates. Children with disabilities have access to all of the educational programs and services available to non-disabled children, including art, music, EL, physical education, and extracurricular activities.

Teachers are encouraged to use a variety of teaching methods in all subject areas and include these methods in their lesson plans. Students also have the option to use peer tutors and participate in small group instruction and intervention.

4. Describe how the school provides opportunities for the most academically needy students to receive support and reinforcement of academic skills BEYOND THE REGULAR SCHOOL DAY.

NJHS provides special education services and uses appropriate procedures in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations. Parents may request an evaluation to determine if the student is eligible for special education services. An Individualized Education Plan (IEP) team convenes to determine the eligibility for special education services. The IEP team develops the IEP based on the results of the evaluations, the concerns of the parents, and the academic, developmental, and functional needs. Special education classes will occur only when the nature of severity of the disability is such that education in the general education classroom, including the use of supplementary aids and services, cannot be successfully achieved. When the faculty sends the timely assistance sheets to the parents, there is a section devoted entirely about any modifications the parent can do to assist the student at home. Recommendations are made by the general classroom teacher as to ways to increase the success of the student at home, in addition to what the teacher is doing for the student during the regular school day.

All students identified as Special Populations, have access to all services and programs available, including free/reduced lunch, Title I services, EL services, Special Education services, and counseling services. Students receive a Home Language Survey to determine eligibility for limited-English proficient testing. 1. In what ways are the programs coordinated and integrated toward the achievement of the schoolwide goals?

North Jackson High School will utilize all available resources to achieve both local and state goals. Federal funds, along with funding from state and local sources, will be coordinated and integrated to provide a total program designed to foster educational improvement and high academic achievement for all students. In order to further the effort, a consolidated plan is developed, and revised yearly, by Jackson County Schools, to utilize federal funds to provide maximum benefit to all students. The purpose of the plan is to insure that all students are served in the best possible fashion, enabling them to meet challenging content and performance standards. This plan is developed in consultation with the Federal Programs Planning Committee who provides input about allocation of funds, set-asides, administrative costs, and the over-all implementation of the programs. Members of the committee are representatives from all aspects of the system and include administration, principals, teachers, stakeholders, students and parents. Federal Programs goals are congruent with state legislation requirements.

At the end of each year a thorough review of each program will then be conducted and analyzed for effectiveness and necessary changes made. The Federal Programs Planning Committee will again be solicited for input on fund allocation, ideas to improve design, implementation and evaluation. Necessary revisions will be made as indicated by the review. The principal work closely with the Chief Financial Officer for Jackson County Schools in the budgeting, coding, and expenditures of federal funds. Accounting procedures for the federal programs will adhere to the structure outlined in the Financial Planning, Budgeting and Reporting System for Alabama Public Schools. All federal and state regulations will be observed. In addition, state and local auditing requirements will be met. A committee at each school composed of teachers, parents, community leaders, administrators, and students where applicable, will be responsible for designing school programs and developing school budgets.

2. List the State, Federal and local programs that are consolidated/coordinated in the schoolwide program and describe how all programs and resources are coordinated and integrated toward the achievement of the schoolwide goals.

Educational services will be coordinated and integrated to target improved student achievement most effectively. Ongoing collaboration across programs and alignment of state, local, and federal efforts will increase effectiveness, eliminate duplication and combine services. At each school, funds from a variety of sources will be used to implement the overall school improvement plan. Title funds will provide academic programs to assist students to meet state standards and coordinate with other educational services to ensure that the needs of students are met. Special education students are eligible for Title services on the same basis as other students. Through collaborative planning at the school level, services for children with limited-English proficiency are coordinated. Policies are in place to ensure that immigrant, migratory and/or homeless children will receive proper services in the event of their enrollment in the school system. Professional development activities will help teachers encourage students to further advance in the upper levels. Effective professional development will be funded by utilizing monies from Title I, Title II, state, and local funds. The county-wide School Improvement Specialist will also provide professional development to teachers on strategic teaching. Student performance on state assessments will serve as the overall evaluation of the effectiveness of professional development. Teacher surveys and voiced opinions will also be used to evaluate the effectiveness of the activities.

3. How does the school coordinate and integrate the following Federal, State and local services in a manner applicable to the grade level to support achievement of the schoolwide goals: violence prevention programs, nutrition programs, housing programs, Head Start, adult education, vocational and technical education, and job training.

All Jackson County Schools are served by Title I.

Educational services will be coordinated and integrated to target improved student achievement most effectively. Ongoing collaboration across programs and alignment of state, local, and federal efforts will increase effectiveness, eliminate duplication and combine services. At each school, funds from a variety of sources will be used to implement the overall school improvement plan.

At the beginning of the school year, teachers are given hall assignments. Each teacher is responsible to be on duty between bells and at break. Also, students are only allowed to use the restroom when guided to and from by their classroom teacher. The school has access to the local police department should a violent situation occur. However, the level of violence has decreased dramatically over the last several school years simply by having the necessary faculty in place at all times. North Jackson High School follow and abides by district and state mandates in regards to the CNP. We have no homeless students reported by the homeless survey distributed at the beginning of the year; therefore, we have no data on that particular issue. We do not currently house Head start programs. For adult education services, if needed, we can refer them to Mr. Kip Williamson who is currently the director of the Adult Education Center at Northeast Community College in Rainsville. Also, adult education classes are offered locally, free to all adults, at the Michael Scott Learning Center here in Stevenson, Alabama two nights a week. The Jackson County Board of Education has a technical center located in Hollywood, Alabama, where there is a morning and afternoon sessions for students who show interest in technical job training. Also, in the spring semester. All seniors can participate at the Northeast Alabama Community College job fair where students are made aware of different professions.

Component 10: Evaluation

1. How does the school evaluate the implementation of the schoolwide program?

The faculty meets to analyze data and determine strengths and weaknesses in core subjects as well as behavior reports and attendance. After identifying weaknesses, teachers formulated goals and strategies to address these weaknesses in the A-CIP. The ACT was given in the spring to all juniors. We have given tests and analyzed our attendance data. In addition to this we looked at the SIR report, checked our staffing changes, free and reduced lunch percentages, and conducted Advanced ED surveys. The school also views the resources available outside of the school for additional assistance for our students if needed.

2. How does the school evaluate the results achieved by the schoolwide program using data from the State's annual assessments and other indicators of academic achievement?

The results of the ACT are as follows. 112 students were tested. Average ACT scores for North Jackson High School compared to the state: English 16.2 (18.7-state), Mathematics 16.1 (18.3-state), Reading 17.9 (19.7-state), and Science 17.0 (19.1-state). Our average ACT composite score was a 16.9 compared to a 19.1 for the state of Alabama. The SIR report yielded that we had a total of 31 incident reports with 35% of those incidents being fighting, 23% for disobedience. At North Jackson 26% of our faculty are new to the school. Seventy-four percent of our student population take advantage of the government funded lunch program with 64.93% receiving free lunch and 8.98% receiving reduced lunch. We had insufficient data when conducting our Advanced ED surveys. The results are evaluated and new strategies are decided upon by administration and teachers. The ACT is a top priority; therefore, different strategies are based upon different student needs. At the moment, teachers are focused on utilizing USA Test Prep for ten minutes daily to help prepare students for the ACT and those strategies must be reflected in weekly lesson plans

3. How does the school determine whether the schoolwide program has been effective in increasing the achievement of students who are furthest from achieving the standards?

Each 4.5 weeks, students who receive averages of less than 70, the teacher must set bench marked goals for each individual student and update each week on how those benchmarks are increasing. If a student has a 59 or below then the teacher makes to 2 attempts to contact the parents to collaborate on the best course to assist the student. If there is no advancement, the student are given the opportunity to work through ACCESS or credit recovery, if the course is failed which are both offered on campus. If these are unsuccessful, the student is referred to the county PLUS program where credits can be obtained for students who are behind on needed credits.

4. What process is followed by the school to revise the plan as necessary, based on the evaluation, to ensure continuous improvement of students in the schoolwide program?

The A-CIP team monitors the plan continuously throughout the year and documents strategies that have provided success. Each member of the team is responsible for different portions and when the team meets annually, these suggestions are discussed and modified and new interventions are implemented where and when necessary.

One meeting scheduled during the day and the other is scheduled at night to provide flexible hours to meet the needs of working parents. - 2) The Federal Programs Advisory Committee is comprised of parents, teachers, administrators, and community members. The handbook provides clear detailed descriptions of rules, regulations, and expectations that are set by the Jackson County Board of Education. At the beginning of each school year a parent meeting is held at every school in which the Title I program is explained to parents. During this meeting the need for parental involvement is explained with the desire to foster positive family and community relationships. Parents are given the opportunity to voice concerns and ask questions. A letter explaining the materials available at the Parent Center is sent home at the beginning of the school year inviting parents to use the facility.
